Getting Started

You can choose to fundraise individually, join an existing team or create your own team. See instructions on the next page on how to start your team fundraiser, individual fundraiser or how to join an existing team. If you need help deciding the right approach for you, please read the options below:



Who should create an individual fundraiser? Those with a cause close to their heart who want to rally their friends and family to support that cause.

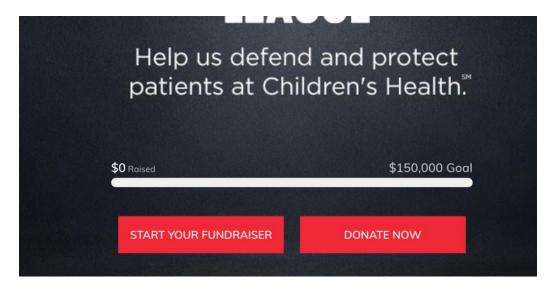
Who should create a team? Those who want to recruit multiple fundraisers for the same cause to have an exponential reach and make the largest impact.

Who should join a team? Those who want to support an existing team that is raising money for a cause that is important to them – or those who want to support friends or family by raising money through their network.



How do I create my own fundraiser?

 When you want to create an individual fundraiser for the Red Balloon League, please click the 'Start a Fundraiser' button on the Red Balloon League campaign homepage (donate.childrens.com/JoinRBL).



2. Choose to fundraise as an individual when the option appears.





3. Create an account using the signup forms. If you already have an account, log in.

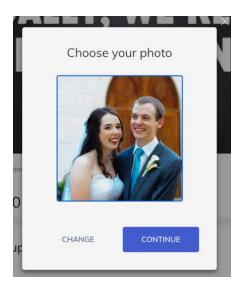


4. Next, you'll be asked to enter your fundraising page's details such as your fundraising goal, end date, and headline. You'll also be asked to choose your fundraiser's designation. We have five options to choose from, including Mental and Behavioral Health Programs, Clinical Research, Enhancements for Children's Health Dallas Campus, Expansion to Children's Health Plano Campus and Children's Health's Greatest Need. Select one and hit 'Next' to move on.

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5. Then, you'll be asked to choose your fundraising page profile picture. Please choose an engaging photo of yourself, as this will make your page feel more personal.



6. When you're done signing up, you'll see your fundraising page. The last step is to edit your page's details. To do so, tap the Manage button at the top of the screen to open your editor. We encourage you to change your Story content, post updates, and change the details of your page to give prospective donors a sense of why you are fundraising and how their gifts will impact Children's Health positively.

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How do I form a team?

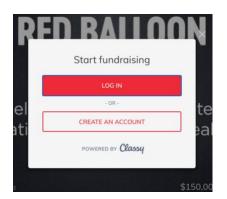


2. Choose to create a team when the option appears.





3. Create an account using the signup forms. If you already have an account, log in.



4. Next, you'll be asked to enter your team's details such as your team name (be fun and creative!), fundraising goal and headline. You can also enter a short URL—a shorter version of your fundraising page's website address for easy sharing. Hit 'Create Team' to move on.

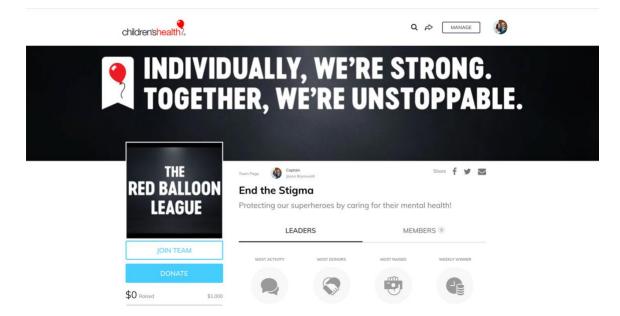
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5. Upload a profile picture for your team fundraising page. We encourage uploading a picture of you and your team members or something that represents what you will be raising funds for. You can always change your photo later.



6. When you're done signing up, you'll see your team page. The last step is to edit your page. To do so, tap the Manage button at the top of your screen to open your editor. We encourage you to change your Story content, post updates, and change the details of your page to give prospective donors a sense of why you are fundraising and how their gifts will impact Children's Health positively. Make sure to include instructions on which designation donors should choose when fundraising for your team!

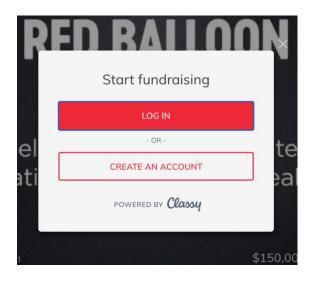
2. Choose to join a team when the option appears.



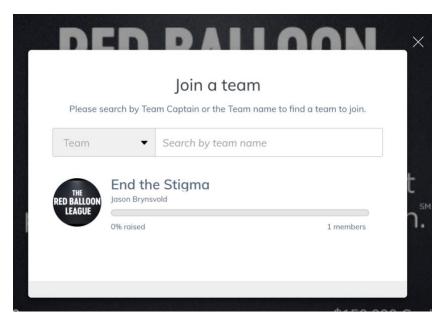


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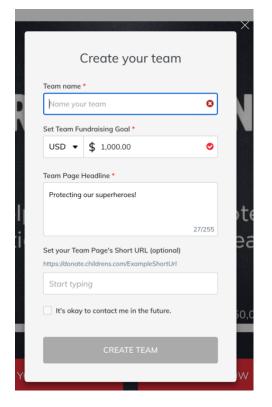


4. Search for your team by team name or team captain name. If you don't know either, ask the person who recruited you to join for this information.

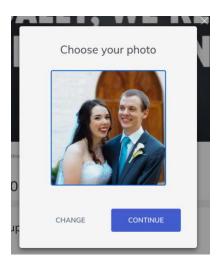




5. When you join the team, you will be asked to create your personal fundraising page. You may be wondering why you need to create an individual page. Every member of a team needs to create an individual page in order to join.



6. Upload a profile picture for your fundraising page. This photo will also appear on the team fundraising page under the members list. You can always change this photo later.
